Dress Code

We want all our guest, visitors and members to enjoy their round of golf when playing at Shaw Hill and to help us achieve this we have a strict dress code that **must** be adhered to at all times whilst on the course.

Please refer to our dress code below as we reserve the right to refuse entry onto the course if this code is not adhered to. Should you need any additional copies please contact us and we will be happy to email or post you a copy out.

Dress Code Requirements

ACCEPTABLE

Men's shirts must have a collar and sleeves

Tailored shorts or long trousers

Proper golf bag with at least five clubs

Long or short (above-ankle), white sports socks to be worn with shorts

Golf shoes with soft spikes

NOT ACCEPTABLE

Football shirts, t-shirts or tracksuits

Shirts pulled outside trousers

Sports shorts, beach shorts, torn/unwashed denim, or tracksuit trousers

No golf bag

Trousers tucked into socks, or shorts with below-ankle length socks

Non-golf shoes / trainers or metal spiked shoes

Handicap Certificate Conditions

We may request that each of your group produces their handicap certificates at either the professional shop or to our Course Marshall on the day of your round/s. Failure to produce an official handicap may result in withdrawal of the complimentary golf or refund of green fee for each individual concerned.

Tee Times

Golf must be played at the times stipulated by the Hotel, however, we do endeavour to book your tee –times as close to those you have requested. As golf is complimentary, no cash refund or alternative will be offered for non-play, including adverse weather. Any additional rounds can be booked 7 days in advance of your arrival date and will be charged at 50% off the normal advertised green fee.

Should your golf break fall in the winter months (Oct – Apr), please be aware that, as with many golf courses at that time of year, you may be playing off fairway mats, winter greens and a trolley ban may be in place to help protect the course.

General Golf Rules

- Each player must be aware of the dress code and carry a proper golf bag with a minimum of five clubs. No sharing of clubs is permitted.
- Changing rooms are provided. Please use them to change.
- Every player must pay a Green Fee or your hotel package that includes a Green Fee before playing. Package Green Fees are not transferable or refundable.
- Non-players (adults or children) are NOT permitted to walk the course at any time under any circumstances, unless agreed by a member of golf staff prior.
- The management reserve the right to pair-up matches when necessary.
- A maximum of four players is permitted in each match.
- No dogs are allowed on the course or putting green.

Etiquette

- All matches start from the first tee, unless told otherwise by a member of golf staff.
- Before teeing off, a player must make sure that the match in front has completed the hole and cleared the green.
- If a ball is in danger of striking a person it is the duty of the player who struck the ball to shout the customary warning “FORE”.
- Play without delay. On a busy day, games start on the first tee every eight minutes.
- Players must therefore try to complete each hole in 8 – 10 minutes.
- Pitch marks must be repaired on the greens, divots replaced and bunkers raked after use.
- Instructions of the General Manager, Golf Professionals, and Course Marshall must be complied with at all times.

Dress Code

- Smart dress is to be worn at all times. Shorts are permitted providing they are knee length, tailored and are worn with white, ankle length sports socks. No tracksuits or collarless shirts are permitted.
- Players must wear proper golf shoes with Soft-spikes or dimpled soles. No trainers, hockey shoes or cricket shoes are permitted.
- Clubhouse dress code is smart casual - this does not include beachwear.

Enforcement

- All Golf Staff are fully authorised to request any golfer whose dress does not comply with the dress code, to leave the course.
- Please avoid embarrassing situations, as no member of staff is permitted to allow any exceptions to this rule.
- Golfers being uncooperative or abusive to staff will be asked to leave the area of the golf course, and may be subject to suspension.
